
But the fruit of the Spirit is love,

Why is knowing the Fruit of the Spirit so important?




Turn to Romans 8:29-30



- 1) Bring unbelievers to faith in Christ
- 2) Conform believers to the image of the Son of God who is the image of God

The Holy Spirit is God's agent to

- 1) Justify the sinner—that is declare the sinner righteous
- 2) Sanctify the believer—that is set the believer apart from the rest of the world


Faithful

Consider Abraham & Moses



Nehemiah 9:7–8

- You are the LORD, the God who chose Abram and brought him out of Ur of the Chaldeans and gave him the name Abraham. ⁸ You found his heart faithful before you, and made with him the covenant to give to his offspring the land of the Canaanite, the Hittite, the Amorite, the Perizzite, the Jebusite, and the Girgashite. And you have kept your promise, for you are righteous.

¹ Miriam and Aaron spoke against Moses because of the Cushite woman whom he had married, for he had married a Cushite woman. ² And they said, “Has the LORD indeed spoken only through Moses? Has he not spoken through us also?” And the LORD heard it. ³ Now the man Moses was very meek, more than all people who were on the face of the earth. ⁴ And suddenly the LORD said to Moses and to Aaron and Miriam, “Come out, you three, to the tent of meeting.” And the three of them came out. ⁵ And the LORD came down in a pillar of cloud and stood at the entrance of the tent and called Aaron and Miriam, and they both came forward. ⁶ And he said, “Hear my words: If there is a prophet among you, I the LORD make myself known to him in a vision; I speak with him in a dream. ⁷ Not so with my servant Moses. **He is faithful in all my house.** ⁸ With him I speak mouth to mouth, clearly, and not in riddles, and he beholds the form of the LORD. Why then were you not afraid to speak against my servant Moses?”



**Neither Abraham or Moses remained
faithful under easy or moderately
challenging times or circumstances.**

- **God called Abraham to sacrifice the life of his only Son.**
- **God called Moses to lead a stiff-necked rebellious people.**




Listen to the Words of Jesus

11 As they heard these things, he proceeded to tell a parable, because he was near to Jerusalem, and because they supposed that the kingdom of God was to appear immediately. ¹² He said therefore, “A nobleman went into a far country to receive for himself a kingdom and then return. ¹³ Calling ten of his servants, he gave them ten minas, and said to them, ‘Engage in business until I come.’ ¹⁴ But his citizens hated him and sent a delegation after him, saying, ‘We do not want this man to reign over us.’ ¹⁵ When he returned, having received the kingdom, he ordered these servants to whom he had given the money to be called to him, that he might know what they had gained by doing business. ¹⁶ The first came before him, saying, ‘Lord, your mina has made ten minas more.’

18 And the second came, saying, ‘Lord, your mina has made five minas.’ **19** And he said to him, ‘And you are to be over five cities.’ **20** Then another came, saying, ‘Lord, here is your mina, which I kept laid away in a handkerchief; **21** for I was afraid of you, because you are a severe man. You take what you did not deposit, and reap what you did not sow.’ **22** He said to him, ‘I will condemn you with your own words, you wicked servant! You knew that I was a severe man, taking what I did not deposit and reaping what I did not sow? **23** Why then did you not put my money in the bank, and at my coming I might have collected it with interest?’

24 And he said to those who stood by, ‘Take the mina from him, and give it to the one who has the ten minas.’ **25** And they said to him, ‘Lord, he has ten minas!’ **26** ‘I tell you that to everyone who has, more will be given, but from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away. **27** But as for these enemies of mine, who did not want me to reign over them, bring them here and slaughter them before me.’ ”



- Here is a call for the endurance of the saints, those who keep the commandments of God and their faith in Jesus.




Revelation 17:14




