Thank to our precious Savior that a door of utterance has once again opened! I speak in reference to the lightening of COVID travel restrictions. Once again I have been able to travel (without fear of quarantine) to our ministries in Eastern Europe. Let me catch you up on the last few months of ministry.

On The Road: After a month (March) of mission conferences and mission Sundays in the U.S., I took a two week trip to visit our ministries in Romania and Hungary. I spent a week with our missionaries on the border of Romania and Hungary. I was able to be in all of the churches they have started and are leading (Tinca, Biharkeresztes, Tassad, Calacea, and Gepiu). I spent the last week in Stei, Romania conducting (in person!) a session at our Bible institute with the good people of Maranatha Baptist Church.

There was an extra blessing from God on this trip. My faithful friend and translator, Mirci Pricop arranged for a trip to deliver supplies and the Gospel to a Gypsy village in Ukraine. My heart thrilled as we crossed the border into that war-weary country to visit with those who are hurting. I was privileged to stand in the middle of a crowd and preach the Gospel, seeing six precious souls saved. I was also blessed to be able to hand out much need food supplies.

Here is the U.S. I have also been busy. I have been able to present the ministry in several churches in Florida, Georgia and South Carolina. I also had the privilege of preaching the graduation at Berean Baptist Academy in Fayetteville, NC. The head of the school (Jack Farmer) is a dear friend and former member of Grace Baptist in Baumholder, Germany.

On the Home Front: After Eileen's settlement for her fall three years ago, she has begun several rounds of physical therapy to repair damage done to her jaw and, as we have discovered, her back. Progress is being made in both areas. Sean has returned pretty much to normal. One year and three days after being placed on a ventilator he plans on doing a 5k run (I'm going also). Eileen and I took a vacation with our daughter (Amber) and her family. That was fun and a blessing!

In the Works: I am planning to begin our regular round of visits to Eastern Europe with the first one in September. We will restart our institute in Tinca and continue the institute in Stei. The institute in Stei is coming to a conclusion. We are beginning to plan for a graduation in May. There is also a trip planned at the end of July to Honduras for the purpose of speaking with possible new ministry partners.
