




Reframing Singleness as a Gift



- A) The Struggle is Real-Acknowledge it
 - Companionship
 - Intimacy
 - Finances
 - Decision-Making
 - Co-parenting
 - Solo parenting





- Struggling Well: Practical Ways to Respond

 - Anchor Yourself in Scripture
 - Pursue Community
 - Take Wise Action
 - Preach the Gospel to Yourself





B) Contentment is a choice

Philippians 4:11–13

¹¹ Not that I am speaking of being in need, for I have learned, in whatever situation I am, to be content. ¹² I know how to be brought low, and I know how to abound. In any and every circumstance, I have learned the secret of facing plenty and hunger, abundance and need. ¹³ I can do all things through him who strengthens me.

⁶ But godliness with contentment is great gain, ⁷ for we brought nothing into the world, and ^[a] we cannot take anything out of the world. ⁸ But if we have food and clothing, with these we will be content.

 - 2 Corinthians 3:18




Living Whole, Not Waiting

- Set Healthy Boundaries










Conclusion
