# 988, Suicide & Crisis Lifeline

- Replaced the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline
- Significant increase in usage 2025
- 600,000 contacts (calls, texts, and chats) per month
- Double the contact volume since May 2022



# Social Interactions

- **Average person has 12-16 interactions per day**
- **Conversations, brief exchanges, non-verbal communications**
- **27 Conversations per day, 10 minutes each**
- **One short, quality conversation per day can measurably improve emotional well-being.**
- **We have a multitude of opportunities**

- How do we put it into action?





# Be a great listener.

## Don't make it about yourself!

- Be mindful of your surroundings.
- Try not to interrupt or work out a response in your head.
- Watch your body language

### Urgent situations needing a fast response

- Get permission
- Seek out: Pastor, elder, deacon or other trusted believers



Ask good  
questions like  
Jesus.

Why are you anxious? Luke 12:26

What do you think? Matthew 21:28

# Share a personal story to transition to the gospel.

“I haven’t been through the exact situation that you just mentioned, but I have had a similar experience..” (problems, issues, or concerns)

Share how God worked through your situation.

ASK

“Where are you spiritually?”

# Repent and Pray

- **Discovery that needs repentance**
  - Pray for the situation
  - **Pray for wisdom and understanding**

Cary a small bible or 'cheat sheet'

Memorize verses to share



# Share the Gospel Plan of Salvation

- Not a believer, Keep it simple
  - God's Design for man
  - Sin leads to brokenness
- Gospel (Good News) to restoration
- Tools to help (study bible; guide on how and where to begin)

# Follow Up!

- Build upon the relationship
- Talk to and pray with the person.
- Ask what God is doing in their life
- Encourage them to share with others
- Invite them to church, coffee or other gatherings

# Conclusion

It is hard to wrap our minds around the evidence that the 988 Lifeline has been receiving over 600,000 contacts (calls, texts, and chats) per month. We see the evidence on the news, online, and in person of the brokenness in our state, cities, towns, and communities.

# Conclusion

Jesus said in Matthew 9:37-38, “The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few, then he instructed his disciples to pray to the Lord of the harvest to send out more workers into the field. We as believers can start our laboring, by turning everyday conversations to Christ.
