

Galatians 1:1




**Paul, an apostle—not from men nor

Galatians 1:13

- For you have heard of **my former life** in Judaism, how I persecuted the church of God violently and tried to destroy it.



A Word of Caution

Everyone doesn't
have a former life.
And that is Good &
Glorious!



Saul (Paul)

- **Born in the City of Tarsus (c. AD 5)**
- Roman citizen by birthright (Acts 22:28)
- **A Jew of the Tribe Benjamin**
- Taught by Gamaliel a doctor of the Law
- **Self-described as a Pharisee (Phil 3:5)**
- **Tentmaker by trade (Acts 18:3)**

Acts 7:59-8:1

**We turn because the act of turning
increases the probability we will
remember the text in the future.**



Acts 7:59

- And they stoned Stephen, calling upon God, and saying, Lord Jesus, receive my spirit. ⁶⁰ And he kneeled down, and cried with a loud voice, Lord, lay not this sin to their charge. And when he had said this, he fell asleep. ¹ And Saul was consenting unto his death. And at that time there was a great [Jewish] persecution against the church which was at Jerusalem; and they were all scattered abroad throughout the regions of Judaea and Samaria, except the apostles.



Acts 8:2

- Devout men buried Stephen and made great lamentation over him.
- But Saul was ravaging the church, and entering house after house, he dragged off men and women and committed them to prison.



Turn to Acts 9



Acts 9:1

- But Saul, still **breathing threats and murder** against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest and asked him for letters to the synagogues at Damascus, so that if he found any belonging to the Way, men or women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem.



Acts 9:2–3

- and asked him for letters to the synagogues at Damascus, so that if he found any belonging to the Way, men or women, he might **bring them bound to Jerusalem.** ³ Now as he **went on his way, he approached Damascus, and suddenly a light from heaven shone around him.**



Acts 9:4–5

- And falling to the ground, he heard a voice saying to him, “Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?”
- ⁵ And he said, “Who are you, Lord?”

And he said, “I am Jesus,
whom you are persecuting.

He is the one and only Son of God.

**He was born about 2000 years ago in
Bethlehem of Judea.**

He was conceived by the Holy Spirit of God.

**His mother was Mary and his father was a
carpenter named Joseph.**

He lived a perfect life—completely without sin.

He was a teacher and miracle worker.



His life was characterized by 'doing good.'

**His disciples dedicated their lives to following
Him and spreading His message.**

**He said His Father was God and He performed
miracles of all types to authenticate the truth of
His words.**



He said He would build an assembly of followers and not even the gates of hell would keep this from happening.

He predicted his own death and resurrection and both came to pass just as He said.

At the age of 33 the Roman Empire crucified Him for crimes He did not commit.

But 3 days later He rose from the grave.



He remained on the earth for 40 more days proving to many that He in fact had risen from the grave until he ascended into the clouds to be taken to heaven and promised He was coming again.

Now He reigns on the throne of God making intercession for all who believe as the one mediator between the creator God of the Universe and mankind.

**Paul's personal encounter with
the resurrected Lord and other
encounters may help us understand
why Paul puts such emphasis on the
resurrection of Christ.**

Look @ the last phrase in Gal 1:1



Galatians 1:1

- Paul, an apostle—not from men nor through man, but through Jesus Christ and God the Father, **who raised him from the dead—**



The bodily resurrection of Jesus Christ is the most fundamental and essential truth of the entire Christian faith.

This is the validation of validations!

You must believe Jesus rose from the dead to be saved.



Acts 9:6–7

- **But rise and enter the city, and you will be told what you are to do.”**
- **The men who were traveling with him stood speechless, hearing the voice but seeing no one.**



Acts 9:8–9

- Saul rose from the ground, and although his eyes were opened, he saw nothing.
- So they led him by the hand and brought him into Damascus.
- And for three days he was without sight, and neither ate nor drank.



Acts 9:10–11

- Now there was a disciple at Damascus named Ananias. The Lord said to him in a vision, “Ananias.” And he said, “Here I am, Lord.” ¹¹ And the Lord said to him, “Rise and go to the street called Straight, and at the house of Judas look for a man of Tarsus named Saul, for behold, he is praying,



Acts 9:12–13

• and he has seen in a vision a man named Ananias come in and lay his hands on him so that he might regain his sight.” ¹³ But Ananias answered, “Lord, I have heard from many about this man, how much evil he has done to your saints at Jerusalem.



Acts 9:14–15

- And here he has authority from the chief priests to bind all who call on your name.” 15 But the Lord said to him, “**Go, for he is a chosen instrument of mine to carry my name before the Gentiles and kings and the children of Israel.**




Remember

Is identified by Matthew as the first disciple Jesus called to follow him


Is one of three chosen to see the transfiguration of Jesus

Is the undeniable leader of 'the twelve'

He is one on whom Jesus says, "I will build my church..."






Galatians 2:11

beloved brother?




**Paul is a brother

Jesus is the Christ!**




**Peter is fully convinced that
Paul has been adopted into the family
of God and there is nothing in Paul's
life from conversion to death that calls
into question the legitimacy of his
conversion.**

Do you know John 1:12-13?



John 1:12–13 (NASB95)

- But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become **children of God**, *even* to those who believe in His name,¹³ **who were born**, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but **of God**.

second birth.**




**Peter is a witness of

Galatians 1:11-12


- For I would have you know, brothers, that the gospel that was preached by me is not man's gospel.
- For I did not receive it from any man, nor was I taught it, but I received it through a revelation of Jesus Christ.



**Don't miss what is being
communicated in this text.**

**The resurrected Jesus, who
ascended to heaven, is revealing
truth to Paul.**

Look back at v. 1

**Paul is unequivocally
advocating for the authenticity of
his position as an Apostle.**

**Paul is establishing his authority
because he is going to bring great
correction to the churches in
Galatia.**



1 Corinthians 11:23

•**For I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread,**



Next notice the level of authority Peter attaches to Paul's writings.



We need to admit that there are things in the Bible that are hard to understand.


The Bible is difficult and no one man had a lock on the correct understanding on the most difficult tensions and truth of doctrine.

#1 People twist Scripture

By modifying the
God of the Bible into
their own god.



#2 People twist Scripture

By disregarding the
exclusivity of Christ;
Jesus Himself made
clear.



#3 People twist Scripture

By purporting that
Scripture contains the
Word of God thus
undermining its
authority.



#4 People twist Scripture

By denying the necessity
of a transforming life
when authentic salvation
has taken place.
