Galatians 1:6-9



I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting him who called you in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel—⁷ not that there is another one, but there are some who trouble you and want to distort the gospel of Christ.⁸ But even if we or an angel from heaven should preach to you a gospel contrary to the one we preached to you, let him be accursed.


• **I am astonished** that you are so quickly deserting him who called you in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel—

This is a very strong word.

**Called refers to the work
of God in bringing one to
salvation.**



Notice the inseparable link or relationship Paul makes between God and His Gospel.


Notice

**You can't turn to another or
different Gospel and still abide
in Christ.**

**To leave the gospel is to leave
the God and Savior of the one
true Gospel.**



The exclusivity Paul is establishing is stunning.


We don't have multiple paths (gospels) to the same God.

The gospel is the means by which man is reconciled to God.

Paul is rejecting the view that there are multiple ways that man can be reconciled to God.


Gospel literally means—

2. Human Responsibility.




1 Corinthians 15:1

•Now I would remind you,
brothers, of the
gospel I preached to
you,



Paul tells us about the church at Corinth's reception to the Gospel before He defines it.



1 Corinthians 15:2

•which you received, in which you stand, and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain.



Notice everything v. 2 tells us:

- Received (believed in the past)
- You stand (presently believe)
- If you hold fast (continue to believe)


2. Human Responsibility



Emphasize!


Salvific belief (authentic faith) is not intellectual assent.

You don't believe on Jesus as your Savior in the same way you believe that Neil Armstrong walked on the moon.



1 Corinthians 15:2

•which you received, in which you stand, and **by which you are being saved**, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain.



Notice

**Those who received, believe and
stand on the gospel are being
saved.**



Saved People have been

- **Born from above by the Holy Spirit**
- **Sealed & indwelt with the Holy Spirit**
- **Adopted into the family of God**
- **Credited with the righteousness of Christ**
- **Forgiven of all their sins: past, present and future**
- **Granted membership in the body of Christ**
- **Given eternal life**

Are

- **Eternally secure in Christ Jesus**

Will be


- **Rescued from the wrath of God and hell**
- **Made righteous by Christ Jesus**


1 Corinthians 15:3b–4

That Christ



- **The Man**
- **God's Anointed One (the Messiah)**
- **The one and only Son of God**
- **The 2nd Person of the Triune Godhead**
- **Jesus who saves His People**
- **Of Nazareth**

The Eternal Gospel



The gospel is the good news that God is reconciling sinners to Himself eternally through the sacrificial and substitutionary death, burial, and resurrection of the man Christ Jesus through authentic faith in what Jesus, the one and only Son of God, accomplished on a tree 2000 years ago on a skull-shaped hill in the city of Jerusalem.




Now Back To Galatians



Galatians 1:6

is any gospel that
changes or adds to the
1 Cor. 15 definition**

Galatians 2:14

- But when I saw that their conduct was not in step with the truth of the gospel, I said to Cephas before them all, “If you, though a Jew, live like a Gentile and not like a Jew, how can you force the Gentiles to live like Jews?”



Galatians 3:3

- Are you so foolish?
- Having begun by the Spirit, are you now being perfected by the flesh?



From the content of the letter to the churches of Galatia it appears that those who were forcing Gentiles to live like Jews were the ones distorting the gospel or leading people to leave grace alone and add keeping the Mosaic law.



Galatians 1:7

- but there are some who
trouble you and want to
distort the gospel of
Christ.



There are two ways to distort the Gospel.

1. Change the who,
what, why, or how.



For example, Jesus wasn't

- **the Son of God; he was a prophet**
- **born of a virgin**
- **without sin**
- **the one and only Son of God**



For example, Jesus died to

- **create financial equity among people**
- **eliminate poverty**
- **heal physical and mental illness**



For example, Jesus did not

- **die**
- **rise from the grave**



Galatians 1:7

There are two ways to distort the Gospel.

2. Human
Responsibility.



In the 1st century, Jews were telling Gentile converts they had to keep the Mosaic law.

In other words it wasn't grace alone.

Or what Christ accomplished wasn't sufficient.



Today “churches” add

- **keeping the sacraments to the gospel**
- **baptism to the gospel**
- **speaking in tongues to the gospel**



Some add the requirement to:

- **pray a prayer**
- **confess sins**
- **repent of all your sins**



How do we
communicate the
necessity of good works
without distorting the
Gospel?



**Over emphasizing the
importance of good works as
salvific distorts the gospel**

**But suggesting faith without works
is salvific faith also distorts the
gospel**

Authenticate Christians



- **Get baptized as a profession of faith**
- **Will pray often and always**
- **Confess sin whenever necessary**
- **Repent as often as needed**
- **Manifest the gifts of the Spirit**
- **Celebrate communion**

But not to get or keep salvation
