•Bessed is the one who reads aloud the words of this prophecy, and blessed are those who hear, and who keep what is written in it, for the time is near.

We should not be surprised to find 7 beatitudes (bestowal of blessing) in the book that is the Revelation Jesus Christ considering the reality that Jesus began his preaching ministry with the word "blessed."



I think Revelation 7:15-17 provides us a beautiful description of what blessed looks like with words we can relate to.



"Therefore they are before the throne of God, and serve him day and night in his temple; and he who sits on the throne will shelter them with his presence. 16 They shall hunger no more, neither thirst anymore; the sun shall not strike them, nor any scorching heat. 17 For the Lamb in the midst of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of living water, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes." 1967 - 2017

Turn to Revelation 7:13ff



Revelation 7:13-14

 Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, clothed in white robes, and from where have they come?" 14 I said to him, "Sir, you know." And he said to me, "These are the ones coming out of the great tribulation. They have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.



<u>Isaiah 61:10 (ESV)</u>

I will greatly rejoice in the LORD; my soul shall exult in my God, for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation; he has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decks himself like a priest with a beautiful headdress, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels.



Turn to Revelation 19:1



After this I heard what seemed to be the loud voice of a great multitude in heaven, crying out, "Hallelujah! Salvation and glory and power belong to our God, ² for his judgments are true and just; for he has judged the great prostitute who corrupted the earth with her immorality, and has avenged on her the blood of his servants." 3 Once more they cried out, "Hallelujah! The smoke from her goes up forever and ever." 4 And the twenty-four elders and the four living creatures fell down and worshiped God who was seated on the throne, saying, "Amen. Hallelujah!" 5 And from the throne came a voice saying, "Praise our God, all you his servants, you who fear him, small and great." ⁶ Then I heard what seemed to be the voice of a great multitude, like the roar of many waters and like the sound of mighty peals of thunder, crying out, "Hallelujah! For the Lord our God the Almighty reigns. 7 Let us rejoice and exult and give him the glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and his Bride has made herself ready; 8 it was granted her to clothe herself with fine linen, bright and pure"— for the fine linen is the righteous deeds of the saints.

Did we not see earlier that our righteous deeds follow us into eternity?

Revelation 19:9



 And the angel said to me, "Write this: Blessed are those who are invited to the marriage supper of the Lamb." And he said to me, "These are the true words of God."

Remember "Lamb" reminds us of Christ's substitutionary work on the cross, shedding His blood, for our sins, dying in our place, so that we do not have to experience the wrath of God.




John 1:29 (ESV)

The marriage supper of the Lamb is the celebration that the bridegroom (Christ) and the bride (the church) are NO longer separated.



Everyone at the Marriage Supper of the Lamb is part of the body of Christ.


Revelation 20:6

The saints of God are holy in two ways.


First, Christ righteousness has been applied to their account (imputed) thus they are now righteous or holy.

•Blessed are they that do his commandments, that they may have right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates into the city.

Revelation 22:14 (ESV)



•Blessed are those who wash their robes, so that they may have the right to the tree of life and that they may enter the city by the gates.





The Bible contains textual variants and translation variants.

- 1. A textual variant means we are not sure what the original manuscript contained in the original language.
- 2. A translation variant occurs when translation committees do not agree on how the original language should be translated.

Revelation 7:14 answered the question: what does it mean to wash your robe?
