



Turn Over To Ephesians 1:3-14



Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, 4 even as he chose us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him. In love 5 he predestined us for adoption to himself as sons through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of his will, 6 to the praise of his glorious grace, with which he has blessed us in the Beloved. 7 In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace, 8 which he lavished upon us, in all wisdom and insight 9 making known to us the mystery of his will, according to his purpose, which he set forth in Christ

¹⁰ as a plan for the fullness of time, to unite all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth. 11 In him we have obtained an inheritance, having been predestined according to the purpose of him who works all things according to the counsel of his will, 12 so that we who were the first to hope in Christ might be to the praise of his glory. 13 In him you also, when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, ¹⁴ who is the guarantee of our inheritance until we acquire possession of it, to the praise of his glory.

Notice

 God's redemption of humans from sin is ALL about the demonstration and the magnification of His glory.



This begs the question: Would there be a "plan of salvation" were it not for God's pursuit of His own glory?




Luke 17:11-19





Our goal must be to do everything to the glory of God.


1 Corinthians 10:31

How do we glorify God?







We can glorify God with our minds—our thinking can glorify



Thinking that rightfully acknowledges God in all His Perfections is glorifying to God.

Thinking that expresses trust and reliance upon God glorifies God.

Thinking that enjoys the creation that God created for His glory glorifies God.

Thinking that magnifies God glorifies God.





We can glorify God with our mouths in speech and song.



Expressing God praise, honor, and distinction to God and about God glorifies God.

Legitimate worship in song glorifies God.

Communicating gratitude can glorify God. Christians should be—no, they must be—characterized as the most thankful people on the planet as recipients of God's grace.





We can glorify God with our hands.

Using our hands in a way that creates or maintains or enhances can glorify God.

A roofer can glorify God in the manner in which shingles are installed with objective of doing it with excellence.

A nurse can glorify God in the way he or she cares for a sick person.

Hospitality can glorify God if the objective of being hospitable is to reflect God's love for us and our love for others.

A cabinet maker can glorify God with the precision of installation.

A janitor can glorify God with the work he or she does if it is done with excellence and an excellent attitude.

#1 All humans are made in the image of God w/o regard to skin color.


#2 Christ died to redeem all ethnicities—Christ died for the world.


#3 The neighbor I am to love as myself cannot be qualified or limited by a skin color.
