



The Theology of Promise

Galatians 3:15-18




To give a human example, brothers: even with a man-made covenant, no one annuls it or adds to it once it has been ratified.¹⁶ Now the promises were made to Abraham and to his offspring. It does not say, “And to offsprings,” referring to many, but referring to one, “And to your offspring,” who is Christ.¹⁷ This is what I mean: the law, which came 430 years afterward, does not annul a covenant previously ratified by God, so as to make the promise void.¹⁸ For if the inheritance comes by the law, it no longer comes by promise; but God gave it to Abraham by a promise.

Remember the Context

Some are saying keeping

Paul is arguing that too much attention is being given to the Mosaic Covenant—the Law—to the exclusion of the Abrahamic covenant.



Galatians 3:2

- Let me ask you only this: Did you receive the Spirit by **works of the law** or by hearing with faith?

“Striving to Do Everything in the Law”



Galatians 3:5

- Does he who supplies the Spirit to you and works miracles among you do so by **works of the law**, or by hearing with faith—

“Striving to Do Everything in the Law”



Galatians 3:10

- For all who rely on **works of the law** are under a curse; for it is written, “Cursed be everyone who does not abide by all things written in **the Book of the Law**, and do them.”



Galatians 3:13

- Christ redeemed us from the **curse of the law** by becoming a curse for us—for it is written, “Cursed is everyone who is hanged on a tree”—

What is the curse of the law?



The Curse of the Law

The curse of the law is the punishment each will receive from the Sovereign God of the Universe for their failure to keep the law.



Covenant



a written agreement or promise usually under seal between two [God and Abraham] or more parties especially for the performance of some action [BUT not in this case].

What is a Promise?



Promise


Turn Back To

Genesis 15:8ff



⁸ But he said, “O Lord God, how am I to know that I shall possess it?”⁹ He said to him, “Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtledove, and a young pigeon.”¹⁰ And he brought him all these, cut them in half, and laid each half over against the other. But he did not cut the birds in half.¹¹ And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away.¹² As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell on Abram. And behold, dreadful and great darkness fell upon him.¹³ Then the LORD said to Abram, “Know for certain that your offspring will be sojourners in a land that is not theirs and will be servants there, and they will be afflicted for four hundred years.¹⁴ But I will bring judgment on the nation that they serve, and afterward they shall come out with great possessions.¹⁵ As for you, you shall go to your fathers in peace; you shall be buried in a good old age.¹⁶ And they shall come back here in the fourth generation, for the iniquity of the Amorites is not yet complete.”¹⁷ When the sun had gone down and it was dark, behold, a smoking fire pot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces.¹⁸ **On that day the LORD made a covenant with Abram, saying, “To your offspring I give this land, from the river of Egypt to the great river, the river Euphrates,**

Since the Abrahamic Covenant was properly ratified, the Covenant God gave Israel through Moses does not annul or modify the promises God originally gave Abraham and his offspring.

Galatians 3:16

- Now the promises were made to Abraham and to his offspring.

Genesis 13:15

•For all the land which thou seest, to thee will I give it, and to thy seed for ever.



Over and over again, I was taught that the reason the millennial kingdom is necessary is to fulfill the **LAND** promise made to Abraham and Israel.

Yet 1000 years is NOT forever.




Genesis 17:8

- And I will give unto thee, and to thy seed after thee, the land wherein thou art a stranger, all the land of Canaan, **for an everlasting possession**; and I will be their God.



Exodus 32:13

- Remember Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, your servants, to whom you swore by your own self, and said to them, ‘I will multiply your offspring as the stars of heaven, and all this land that I have promised I will give to your offspring, and they shall inherit it forever.’ ”



Psalm 37:29

•The righteous shall inherit the land, and dwell therein **for ever.**



Galatians 3:16

- Now the promises were made to Abraham and to his offspring.
- It does not say, “And to offsprings,” referring to many, but referring to one, “And to your offspring,” who is Christ.

Now Paul speaks as an Apostle under the divine inspiration of the Holy Spirit and gives us greater clarity than any Jew had in the OT.



The offspring was not plural. It was singular referring to Christ Jesus—not Israel, Jacob, or the nation Israel.



Galatians 3:17

- This is what I mean: the law, which came 430 years afterward, does not annul a covenant previously ratified by God, so as to make the promise void.






Once again the law given
to Moses has no impact on
the original promise given
to Abraham 430 years
earlier.



Galatians 3:18

- For if the inheritance comes by the law, it no longer comes by promise; **but God gave it to Abraham by a promise.**



The church has NOT put
enough effort into communicating
the **Theology of Promise.**

**The study of what God's Word
says about the Promises the
Triune God made with humans.**

Essential Tenants to the Theology of Promise



- 1. There is a God who communicates.**
- 2. This God does more than communicate. He communicates promises and fulfills divine agreements with humans called covenants.**
- 3. The character and nature of these promises/covenants first set Judaism apart and then Christianity APART from all other man-made religions on the planet.**

Genesis 3:14–15

- **The LORD God said to the serpent, “Because you have done this, cursed are you above all livestock and above all beasts of the field; on your belly you shall go, and dust you shall eat all the days of your life. I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel.”**





Genesis 9:11–12

- I establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of the flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth.” ¹² And God said, “This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations:

- And God heard their groaning, and God remembered his covenant with Abraham, with Isaac, and with Jacob.

Essential Tenants to the Theology of Promise

- 5. Father Abraham is the ultimate example of how one becomes a recipient of divine blessing.**

Galatians 3:19

- Why then the law? It was added because of transgressions, until the offspring should come **to whom the promise had been made**, and it was put in place through angels by an intermediary.



Galatians 3:22

- But the Scripture imprisoned

everything under sin, so that the
promise by faith in
Jesus Christ might be given to
those who believe.



Understanding the theology of promise destroys any notion or suggestion that my good must outweigh my bad in order to be saved.





6. The gospel of Jesus Christ is a promise from God to humanity.


Jesus promised, he would


John 16:7

John 10:10



#1 The Promise of Forgiving Sin




Matthew 26:28

#2 The Promise of Adoption into the Family of God




John 1:12

#3 The Promise of The Holy Spirit




Ephesians 1:13

7. Confidence in the fulfilment of the promise is based on the character and nature (essence) of the One making the promise and nothing more.






