Introduction to Abraham

(Genesis 11:27-25:8)

The First Patriarch of Israel (scriptural father of a people, tribe, nation or group)

Known for his <u>Faith</u> in God <u>Father</u> (patriarch) of the Jews <u>Friend</u> of God (James 2:23) **Abrahamic Covenant:**

Land, Nation, Blessing & Curse, Name All families of the earth blessed Genesis 12:1-3

First mentioned as Abram in Genesis 11:27 whose father was Terah

Terah was an idolater: moon deity in the city Ur located about 200 miles S.E. of Baghdad, Iraq

Born circa 2166 B.C.; lived for 175 years

Life of Abraham spans Genesis 11:27 through 25:8 (gives up the ghost)

Abraham is esteemed in 3 major global religions: Judaism, Christianity and Islam (Quran)

Abraham, Sarah, Hagar, Ishmael, Isaac, Lot, Melchizedek, Keturah, (wife after Sarah)

Abraham referenced in Exo, Lev, Num, Deu, Jos, 1 & 2 Kings, 1 & 2Ch, Psalms, Isa, Jer, Eze, Micah

- Father of the circumcised (Romans 4:12)
- Abraham believed God (Galatians 3:6)
- Abraham heard the gospel (Galatians 3:8)

- Melchizedek and Abraham (Hebrews 7:1-9)
- Abraham's faith (Hebrews 11)
