In the simplest terms, what is the gospel?


The gospel is the good news that Christ died for our sins.



1 Corinthians 15

v. 1-4

¹ Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, ² and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain. 3 For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, 4 that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures,



The gospel is the good news that God is redeeming and reconciling sinners to Himself eternally through the sacrificial and substitutionary death, burial, and resurrection of the man Christ Jesus through authentic faith in what Jesus, the one and only sinless Son of God, accomplished on a tree in the city of Jerusalem 2000 years ago.

Authentic: that which is real, true, genuine and from the heart

Christ: the promised king and deliverer of the Jews, Messiah

Crucify: to put to death by nailing or binding to a cross

Faith: belief and trust in Christ alone and the salvation He provides

God: the Supreme eternal triune Being who created everything and governs all things

Gospel: the message of salvation found in Jesus

Jesus: the second Person of the triune God who is fully God and fully man born of a virgin

Reconcile: bring back to a former state of harmony, to eliminate hostility

Redeem: to free from the consequences of sin including the wrath of God

Sacrificial: the death of Jesus as a sin offering to God

Salvation: deliverance from the power of sin and punishment in hell

Sin: any violation or trespass of God's law

Sinners: individuals who acknowledge their guilt before God and their need for a Savior

Substitutionary: Jesus taking the place of sinners

Tree: the cross on which Jesus was crucified


