- In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. ² This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria.

Luke 2:3

- And all went to be registered, each to his own town.



Luke 2:4

•And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David,

Again both Matthew and Luke go overboard in making sure you know that Jesus is of the house of David.

27 to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. And the virgin's name was Mary.

32 He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. And the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David,

69 and has raised up a horn of salvation for us in the house of his servant David,



Luke 2:5

- to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child.



Luke 2:6-7

•And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. ⁷ And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

- And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night.






- When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd.


**Therefore, Christ must be of the Lord

Daniel 9:25-26


- Know therefore and understand that from the going out of the word to restore and build Jerusalem to the coming of an anointed one, a prince, there shall be seven weeks. Then for sixty-two weeks it shall be built again with squares and moat, but in a troubled time. ²⁶ And after the sixty-two weeks, an anointed one shall be cut off and shall have nothing. And the people of the prince who is to come shall destroy the city and the sanctuary. Its end shall come with a flood, and to the end there shall be war. Desolations are decreed.





- And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger.”





Pleasing God is layered and nuanced.



Romans 8:8ff



Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. ¹⁰ But if Christ is in you, although the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is life because of righteousness. ¹¹ If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit who dwells in you.


- but just as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the gospel, so we speak, not to please man, **but to please God** who tests our hearts.






•And without faith it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him.

•When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, “Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us.”




Luke 2:16

- And at the end of eight days, when he was circumcised, he was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb.








